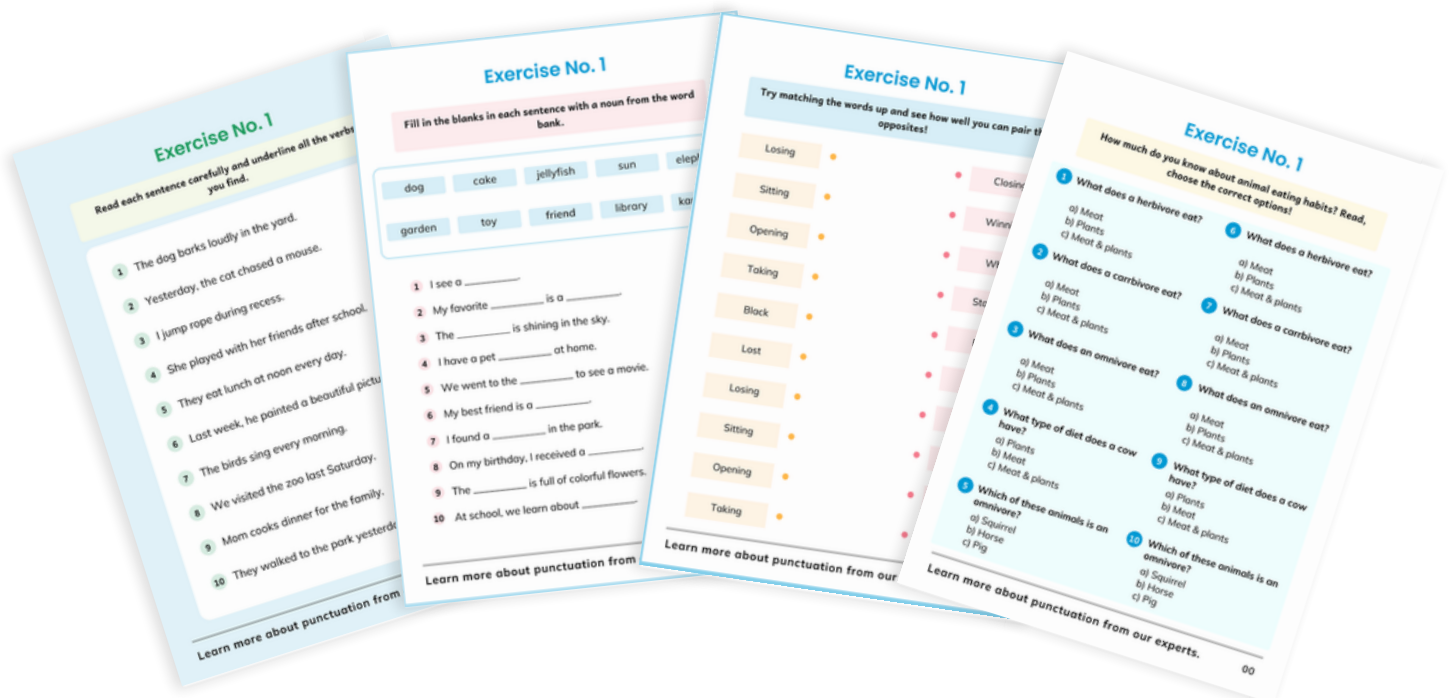

The Final Writing Test
