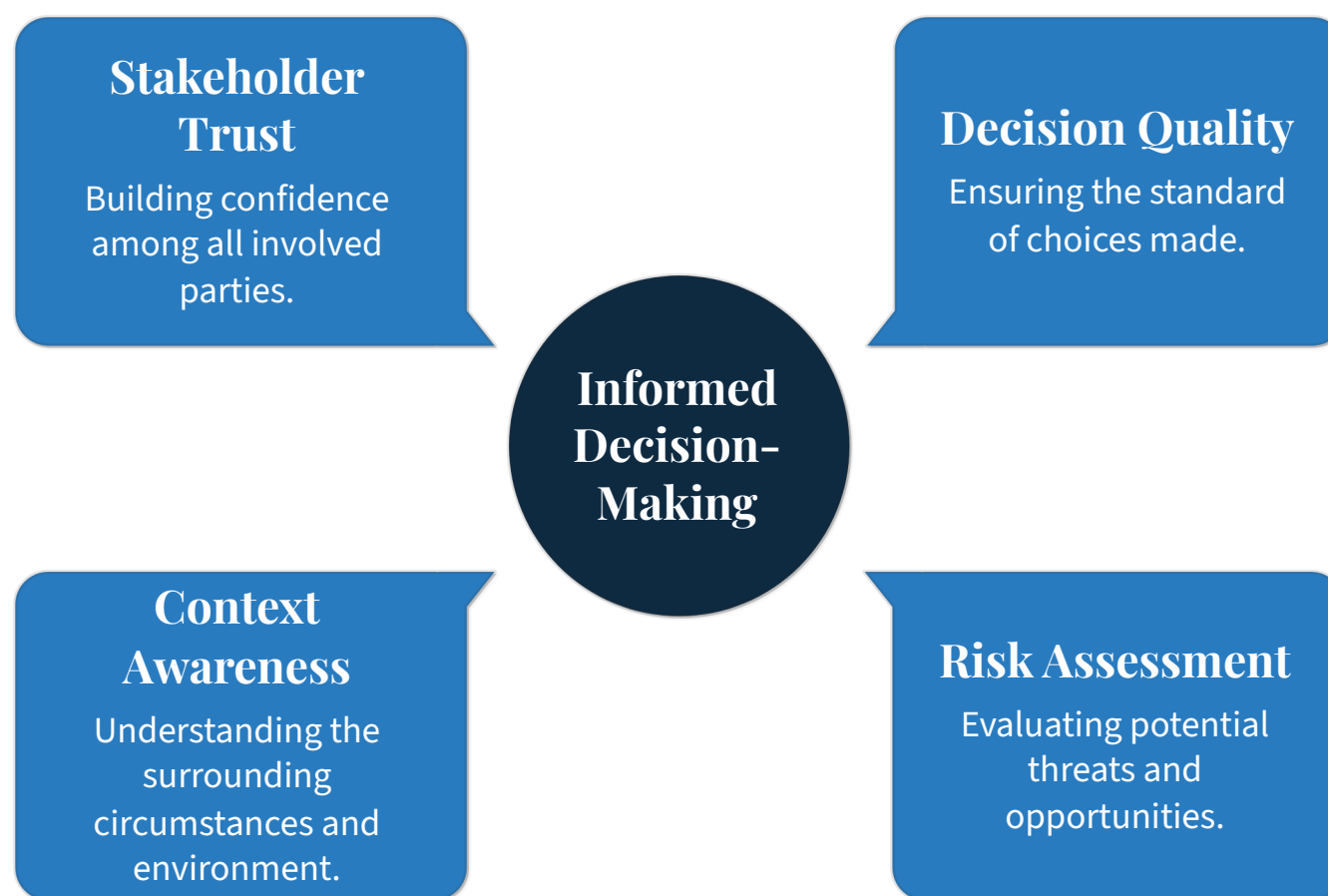


Why Judgment Is the Career Skill Nobody Teaches
